VICTORIA GOLD'S COMMITMENT TO HEALTH AND SAFETY

At Victoria Gold's Eagle Gold Mine, the health and safety of the site's workforce including contractors and visitors to the mine are paramount to the company's philosophy that successful operations begin with engaged employees.

A key component of this approach to health and safety is emergency preparedness and the company's support for the site's Emergency Response Team (ERT).

At the Eagle Gold Mine, the ERT trains for five hours per week on various aspects of emergency response, bringing together health and safety staff and volunteers from various departments across site. Supported by a paramedic and a registered nurse, the ERT also has a fire truck equipped with a comprehensive compliment of firefighting equipment and vehicle extrication tools and a patient transport vehicle.

The ERT includes strong representation from women, including ERT Captain Sarah Hohner, who joined Victoria at the Eagle Gold Mine in May 2020 as an equipment operator and is now a Training Supervisor.

The mine's Joint Health & Safety Committee (JOHSC) meets once per month and is comprised of department supervisors and employee representatives, who help guide, promote and collaborate to uphold a site culture of continual health and safety.
