Selkirk First Nation citizen **Jenna Joe** started at the Eagle Gold Mine on July 8. "I figured this would be a good opportunity to open up new doors," says Jenna, a Yukon University's Environmental Monitoring Program student. "A typical day at site may include ground and surface water sampling or constructing silt fencing. It's good to reinforce what I'm learning in my studies with hands-on experience."

Jenna recommends the experience to other students. A sentiment seconded by fellow summer student **Sean Burke**. "I would definitely encourage other students pursuing environmental or northern studies programs to take this opportunity," says Sean, who is working as a labourer for the mine's Environmental Department and appreciates the experience he is receiving with Victoria, while working in a camp setting.

"I heard the Eagle Gold Mine was the largest gold mine in the Yukon and Victoria Gold was hiring students," says summer student **Oskar Buchanan** as to what drew him to the position. In this role, he assists in the site's carpentry shop.

"There's a lot I'll take away from this experience," continues Oskar. "Patience for one, as well as the ability to keep an open mind, accept new knowledge and listen before speaking and doing."

Responsibilities and requirements for successful applicants included: a willingness to learn; the ability to work independently and in a team environment; a demonstration of initiative and self-motivation; and, the recent graduation from a post-secondary institution or enrolment in the Fall 2020 semester.

ABOUT VICTORIA GOLD & THE EAGLE GOLD MINE

The Eagle Gold Mine, now in production, is part of Victoria's 100-per cent-owned Dublin Gulch Property located approximately 375 kilometres north of Whitehorse and 85 kilometres north, northeast of the Village of Mayo within the traditional territory of the First Nation of Na-Cho Nyak Dun. The property is accessible by road year-round and is connected to Yukon Energy Corp's electrical grid. The mine will be a significant contributor to Yukon employing 350 to 400 people.
